The Central Tennessee New Farmer Academy is a 7-month certificate program designed for those with an interest in becoming agricultural entrepreneurs. Ideal candidates for this program include those who are new to agriculture, those who wish to transition into agriculture from another field, such as military service or private sector work, or those who are looking for a post retirement opportunity.

The program focuses on teaching concepts, providing information, and facilitating the hands-on experience and connections needed to build a solid, viable and successful agricultural business. Our goal is to provide research-based information paired with time-honored practices and real-world examples to introduce you to Agriculture in Central Tennessee. The Tennessee New Farmer Academy is a TEAP approved program. Credit is given for certificates issued after 2018.



DIRECTIONS



TOPIC 1: FARM BUSINESS & MARKETING BASICS:

Over multiple sessions, you will learn to identify the appropriate enterprise for you and your farm, how to start your business, and how to navigate the regulatory issues of the agricultural world. Additionally, you'll learn about some of the most effective marketing strategies, business management skills, and how to apply for grants and other types of assistance programs available to new farmers.

TOPIC 2: AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION PRACTICES:

A portion of each session will be dedicated to helping you establish and/or maintain productive and efficient operations. We will cover topics like soil health, livestock production, fruit and vegetable production, beekeeping, irrigation strategies, organic production, and greenhouse management.

TOPIC 3: HANDS-ON EXPERIENCE:

In addition to classroom instruction, the New Farmer Academy provides hands-on experiential sessions on topics including drip irrigation, plasticulture, fencing installation and repair, sprayer calibration, and equipment operation/safety.
