### **Interview Day!**

- Be on time
- Bring all the documents
- I-20: Print the form we sent you and sign it
- I-901: a copy of your payment
- Print of your Visa appointment confirmation
- Passport: Make sure all information is complete and you have a valid passport
- The acceptance letter we sent you
- Documents of your financial ability to pay for your travel, tuition, and accommodation
- Any other document to prove you plan to return to your country after your studies

Ensure all required immunizations are up-to-date.



- Measles, Mump, Rubella (MMR) vaccine (2 doses)
- Varicella (Chickenpox) Vaccine (2 doses)
- Tetanus diphtheria (No older than 10 years)

F1 Students are required to obtain health insurance that complies with TSU requirements to cover their stay in the U.S

You will take your placement test on the Tuesday before classes start. This test is crucial for determining the appropriate level for your classes.

# REGISTER YOUR CLASSES



After getting your placement results, make sure to register your classes and complete your payment the week before classes begin.

Attend the mandatory International Student
Orientation on the Monday before classes start.
During the orientation, you will learn about campus resources, academic expectations, and immigration regulations and have the opportunity to meet the Intensive English Center staff and other International Students.

Get a local SIM card from AT&T, Verizon, Mint, or T-Mobile for reliable communication.

## DRIVER'S LICENSE/REAL ID

To get a driver's license in Tennessee as an F-1 student, you must be at least 18 and have a continued valid I-20, passport, visa. Bring these documents and 2 proof of residence in Tennessee to a Driver Services Center. Pass the vision, knowledge, and road skills tests. After paying the fees, you'll receive a temporary license, with the permanent card mailed later. Please look at the Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security website for details.



### **BANKING**

You can open an account at a local bank, such as Bank of America, Regions, Chase, Wells Fargo, or local credit unions. It requires passport, Visa, and at least \$500 for initial deposit.

# Safety and Security



## **Campus Safety:**

TSU Police Department: Provides 24/7 campus security services. Familiarize yourself with emergency procedures and contact information.

**CALL 615-963-5171** (instead of calling 911) We advise this to avoid any service delays. A certified, trained TSU police dispatcher will contact the necessary emergency services to assist you.





## Safety

**Personal Safety Tips:** Understand emergency procedures: Familiarize yourself with emergency contacts, including local police, fire department, and medical services.

**Stay informed:** Stay updated with local news and understand any safety advisories or warnings (tornados or floods, for example) in your area.

**Secure your belongings:** Keep your passport, visa documents, and other important papers in a safe place, ideally in a locked drawer or safe.

**Use reliable transportation:** Instead of hitchhiking or accepting rides from strangers, use licensed taxis, ride-sharing services (like Uber or Lyft), or public transportation.

**Be aware of your surroundings:** Stay vigilant in public places, especially crowded areas or places with a reputation for crime. Avoid distractions like texting while walking alone.

**Cultural sensitivity:** Be aware of cultural differences that may affect safety perceptions or interactions with others. Respect local customs and laws.

**Legal matters:** Familiarize yourself with local laws and regulations to avoid unintentional violations.

**Stay connected:** Stay in touch with family and friends back home and establish a support network among international students or local contacts.
