A student will be considered a transfer student if any college work has been taken at another institution. All transfer applicants must: 1. Submit two official transcripts from each college/university attended. 2. Submit an official ACCUPLACER report, if applicable. 3. Have a GPA (based on all courses attempted at Tennessee Board of Regents colleges/universities) equal to TSU’s retention standards. 4. Have a minimum 2.00 GPA, for out-of-state college/university. 5. Take the ACCUPLACER subtest in Mathematics and/or English if the ACT (Enhanced) subscore(s) in the subject(s) is not acceptable or if college credit has not been earned in English and/or Mathematics. 6. Students who have taken remedial and/or developmental courses at a non-TBR institution must undergo ACCUPLACER assessment. However, if they transfer remedial and/or developmental course work which is equivalent to that offered at the University, the course(s) for which the transfer course is equivalent will be waived
