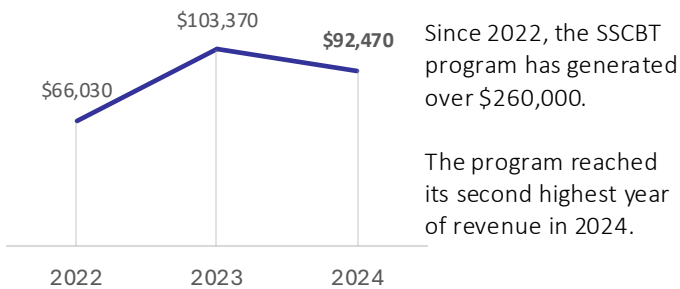


A recognized Head Start Family Services Credentialing Program

Revenue Generated

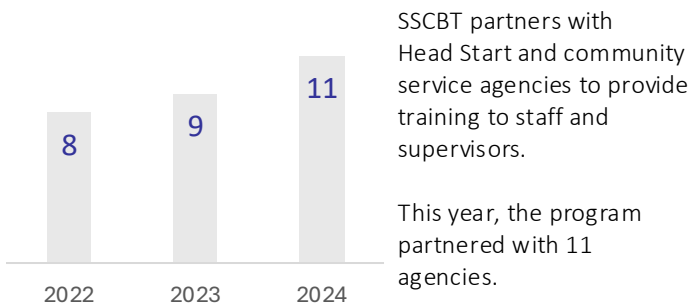

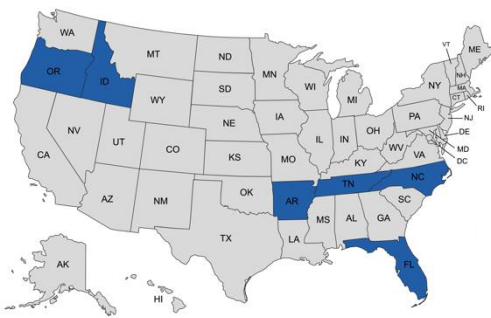


Course Delivery



Training courses consist of three modules delivered in-person and online. Earning the Credential includes 64 competency-based lessons, 90 hours of classroom instruction, observations by a Field Mentor, and a competency-based evaluation. Most interns spend 10 hours per month on program activities outside of class.

States Served



In FY 2024, SSCBT provided training to agencies in five states:

Tennessee

The SSCBT Credential is structured to align with the Head Start Relationship-Based Competencies for Staff Working with Families and meets the fulfillment of requirements under Section 1302.91(e)(7) of the Head Start Performance Standards, Staff Qualifications and Competency. This national standard allows any state to participate in the program.

Since 2017, a total of six states have participated.
