Tennessee State University Public Health Doctorate (PhD) Program in the College of Health Sciences prepares public health professionals in practice, research, and life-long learning; to preserve and promote the health of local, state, regional, national, and international populations through a focus on cultural competency and health disparities.

The Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) degree is an advanced professional degree for public health that prepares researchers at the doctoral level, which focuses on cultural humility and reduction of health disparities. This program examines public health issues through a holistic approach using cultural competency frameworks.

This program is designed for those that have already completed an accredited MPH program or related health master's degree. The PhD in Public Health program is an on-ground, on-campus, traditional format. The program is designed for full-time and part-time students, including early and mid-career working professionals.

The PhD program requires the completion of a minimum of 72 credit hours, with a required dissertation, and may be completed in four years for full-time students. The public health curriculum emphasizes CEPH's core competencies to enable students to become more effective public health researchers.

Applications are for Fall semesters only. Priority deadline is December 1st. Applicants are encouraged to apply early!

PhD Admissions Criteria:

1. Have an MPH or related master's degree
2. Overall GPA at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale)
3. Official transcripts from all institutions attended, including TSU
4. Personal Statement (Two parts)
 - a. Statement of Purpose and Objectives (max. 1500 words)
 - b. Research Statement (max. 500 words)
5. Resume or CV
6. GRE (TSU code: 1803)
7. Three (3) letters of recommendation
8. An interview with the PhD Admissions Committee may be necessary
9. Proof of immunization will be required, if admitted to the program

For International Students:

- Official transcripts and authorized school records with a course-by-course listing of courses and grades received, such transcripts must have been evaluated by a foreign educational credential agency at the student's expense
- TOEFL, IELTS, Duolingo (TSU code: 1803)
- Current, valid passport
- Documentation of financial resources
- Certificate of financial resources
- Certificate of Immunization

Procedures for Admission:

1. Begin the Graduate Admissions application at <http://go.tnstate.edu/inquiryform>.
2. The completion of the form will forward you to GradCAS (<https://gradcas.liaisoncas.org/apply/>) for completion of the electronic application.
 - a. Select one major from the list provided on the application form,
 - b. check the semester of enrollment, and
 - c. indicate the degree sought;
3. The completed application form requires a \$35.00 non-refundable fee to the Graduate School;
4. Request the registrar(s) of all colleges and universities attended (including Tennessee State University) to send one official transcript to the Graduate School;
5. Submit official copies of all test scores appropriate to the degree program to the Graduate School.
