

Nearly half of undergraduates are first-generation students, and it's important to share their stories because all of them matter.




youngest among her 16 siblings. As the Assistant Director for First Year Experience, we shine a light on her first-gen experience. Ms. Gray attended Northern Illinois University, completing her B.A. in Family Therapy and her Master's in Counseling Adult and Higher Education Administration back-to-back. Of those days, she says, "My college experience was different than my peers': I was unable to call home for help," and she also did not have access to support services, like those offered by The You First Project. Resources were tight, and while she was raising her child and learning, she told herself, "Kristin, she can't be what she doesn't see."

That's part of why her personal quote is "I had to create a life I didn't see."

So she set a strong example for her daughter: "I had to create the person I wanted to be. Nothing was given to me; I worked tirelessly for everything I have. I found strength in the face of adversity. I was carried and covered by grace and my mother's prayers. If mom couldn't do anything else, she prayed for me daily!" Being a first-generation student shaped Ms. Gray's perspective on life and work, by teaching her to "have a genuine heart, be compassionate, exude servant leadership, mentor, lend a smile and hand." She summarizes her experience with this last bit of wisdom: "remain humble and be the person you needed when you were going through it." At some point, everyone is "going through it" and needs someone to help them through, just like Kristin Gray implies. We would have loved to support Kristin Gray when she was in school, and we certainly would appreciate getting to know you and help you along your academic, personal, and professional journeys.
